What services are available?

- Walk-in tutoring for college-level writing, math, science, computers, accounting, and the health professions
 - Study groups, by request
 - Study skills, research writing, math skills, learning styles, and stress management workshops



What is the ARTC's tutoring philosophy?

Our tutors adhere to the National Tutoring Association Code of Ethics, which promotes independent thinking and learning. Students are expected to come prepared for tutoring. Tutors cannot complete your work for you.



Who is eligible?

Any Northern Essex Community College student enrolled in any college-level course



What is the application process?

Walk-in tutoring does not require an application; students participate in tutoring during prescheduled times.

You can place tutoring requests for study groups by completing an application in C210 or online.

Study groups are scheduled only if the ARTC receives at least four student requests and are subject to budgetary limitations.



What can I expect from tutoring?

Northern Essex Community College professional and peer tutors are experts in their subject areas. They adapt to various learning styles, while promoting positive study habits. To get the most out of tutoring, you need to bring your determination, conscientious classwork preparation, and positive attitude.
