Beginning with the 2004-2005 academic year, a graduate of the Northern Essex Community College, who meets the following requirements will be automatically accepted for admission and receive junior-class standing in the Education Department at Rivier College for the Bachelor of Arts degree program in Elementary Education/General Special Education:

- Completes the requirements of the Elementary Education major as listed in the current (2003-2004) Northern Essex Community College catalog, and;
- Receives the Associate in Science degree with a minimum of a B- (2.5) grade point average and makes application to Rivier College through the Transfer Articulation Program,

Students who transfer through the Transfer Articulation Program are generally able to complete their remaining requirements for the baccalaureate degree in two more years of full-time study, with one summer of study. Advising material is included with this agreement and early academic advising is strongly recommended.

Entrance Requirements for all students include testing in mathematics and writing; however, graduates of Northern Essex Community College who are transferring to the Education Department at Rivier College and who have completed Contemporary Math II (MAT112) will have fulfilled the basic math core requirements for education majors and will be exempt from math placement testing. The Writing Sample, an institutional assessment tool, is administered to all new students, including students who transfer through the Transfer Articulation Program. Credits earned for ENG101 English Composition I will be accepted for transfer; however, course placement (whether fulfilling the requirement, ENG120 College Composition I, and/or a general elective) will be determined individually upon completion of the Writing Sample and recommendations submitted by department faculty.

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This agreement, effective 2004-2005 academic year, will remain in effect until JUNE, 2007, when it will again be reviewed for renewal. This agreement is subject to catalog and/or program revisions at both institutions; however, this agreement will continue to apply to students who transfer from the Northern Essex Community College Education Program within one year of the expiration of this agreement.

January, 1998: The New Hampshire Department of Education Standards requires students to apply and be formally admitted to a college's teacher certification program. Students, therefore, apply to the Department of Education at Rivier College after successfully completing one education course and one pre-practicum experience. After a review of student academic and professional performance, a determination regarding acceptance in the teacher certification program is made by the education faculty.
