Writing Your Essay



Your essay will be a response to a text that you read and your answer to the question that it asks.

Choose a side

Answer the test question by choosing a side. Stick to your position and make sure everything you write relates to the topic and your view.

For example: If you are asked to write about if schools should require students to wear uniforms, focus <u>only</u> on your opinion about this topic.

Be clear about your main idea

Write a sentence that includes your main idea (your answer to the question) and put it at the end of the first paragraph.

For example: "I believe school uniforms would be better for students, their families, and the school community."

Develop your topic

Write at least 3 examples or short stories to support your answer to the question (your main idea). Why did you choose that side?

 For example: If your main idea is "Students should have to wear uniforms in school.", then you might write about how students could concentrate on school instead of fashion, parents would save money on clothes, and nobody would judge someone else's wealth or taste."

Organize your essay

Write a <u>5 paragraph</u> essay that includes:

- An introduction paragraph that includes a sentence about your main idea.
- 3 body paragraphs with your reasons and examples (stories)
- A conclusion paragraph restating your main idea.

Grammar Tips

Always write in complete sentences.

Each sentence must have a noun and a verb. (He ran.)

For example: "Clothes with designer names." is not a complete sentence.

"Students won't be able to wear clothes with designer names." is a complete sentence.

Vary your sentences.

Try not to write <u>only</u> in simple sentences like: "Uniforms are good."

Use compound sentences also, like: "I think uniforms are good for students' education."



NO"TEXT SPEAK"!

"Do u want 2 go 4 pizza l8r 2day?" is incorrect for college writing.

<u>It should be:</u> "Do you want to go for pizza later today?"
