

TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Merrimack College

Bachelor of Arts in Education

And

Northern Essex Community College

Associate Degree in Elementary Education

Merrimack College and Northern Essex Community College, in recognition of a valuable and barrier free public to private academic experience, have created a transfer articulation agreement between the Merrimack College Department of Education and the Associate of Arts programs at Northern Essex Community College.

OBJECTIVES:

1. To encourage the transfer of qualified students from Northern Essex Community College to Merrimack College.
2. To award academic credit for courses completed at Northern Essex Community College that meet the terms of the Early Childhood and Elementary Education Associate degree for application toward the requirements for the Bachelor of Art Degree in Education.
3. To provide effective and concise guidelines for students seeking to transfer to Merrimack College. Students will have accurate and clear information regarding transfer of their coursework and credits toward the Bachelor of Art in Education.

TERMS OF THE TRANSFER ARTICULATION AGREEMENT:

1. Merrimack College guarantees the acceptance of students who completed the Associate in Science degree programs at Northern Essex Community College with an overall cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better to the Bachelor of Art in Education program at Merrimack College
2. Merrimack College guarantees the transfer of credit as stipulated in the attached Program of Study. This agreement assumes the completion of the Associate Degree and completion of the courses listed on the attached Program of Study. A minimum of 124 credits must be completed to earn the Bachelor of Art in Education degree. Merrimack College will accept no more than 75 credits in transfer from the two-year college. To receive a degree from Merrimack College, a student must fulfill the following residence requirements:
 - a. At least 48 credits must be taken at Merrimack College
 - b. At least ½ of the major credit requirements must be taken at Merrimack College
 - c. At least twenty-four of the last thirty-two credits must be taken at Merrimack College and all credits in the final semester must be taken at Merrimack College
3. Northern Essex Community College transfer students will be subject to all education requirements of Merrimack College as set forth in the Merrimack College catalog.
4. This Articulation Agreement is based upon the evaluation of course descriptions presented to Merrimack College. Courses as listed in this agreement will transfer in as Merrimack College courses provided a grade of “C” or better has been earned. If a grade lower than “C” is earned elective credit will be given.
5. Northern Essex Community College students interested in participating in this agreement should be advised to take the suggested elective courses. These courses are required at Merrimack College and students are advised to complete them as part of their Associate Degree whenever possible.

6. Both Merrimack College and Northern Essex Community College agree to publicize this agreement and availability to their students and other stakeholders.
7. This agreement shall remain in effect for a period of three years from the date listed below, with the provision that the terms specified herein will continue to apply to students admitted from the Northern Essex Community College Associate Degree program within one year of the expiration of the agreement. Each institution agrees to provide timely notice to the other in the event of any modification to the curriculum that might affect the compatibility for admission and transfer of coursework. This agreement may be subject to change at either institution. Students admitted to Northern Essex Community College's Associate degree program prior to such notification shall be admitted to Merrimack College on the basis of this agreement.

**Associates Degree in Elementary Education into the
Department of Education Bachelors of Arts Degree**

Transfer students are able to major in most academic programs at Merrimack College upon entry in conjunction with gaining an education co-major and/or licensure in a particular field. For students coming from NECC's associate degree program in elementary education who wish to complete their BA in two years (four terms), it is strongly recommended that they major in Human Development, with a concentration in elementary education and moderate disabilities. Students would thus graduate with a major in Human Development and dual licensure in elementary education (1-6) and moderate disabilities (PreK-8).
